NextGenAl Call for Papers Submission Guidelines





Format and Presentation

- Submissions can take the form of papers, blogs, videos, or audio
- Paper and blog submissions must be submitted in Microsoft Word format.
- Vlog submissions must be submitted in MP4, AVI, MOV or WMV.
- Audio submissions must be submitted in MP3 or WAV format.
- If images or graphs are included, ensure that they are high-resolution images and graphs, are free from rights restrictions, and are suitable for publication.

Copyright and Intellectual Property Rights

- By submitting your work to AIR, you retain all copyright and intellectual property rights to your submitted work.
- Submission grants AIR the non-exclusive right to use, reproduce, and publicize the work in any manner deemed appropriate for the purposes of the NextGenAl Initiative, without compensation to the author.
- Authors must attest that the work is original, solely theirs, and not part of another body of work that may be previously published.
- Submissions must not infringe upon the intellectual property rights of any third party.

Content and Word Limit

- While there is no strict word limit, we encourage authors to be concise and focused in their submissions.
- The submission should clearly present research findings, innovative ideas, or case studies relevant to the themes outlined.

Legal and Ethical Compliance

- Authors are responsible for ensuring that their work complies with legal and ethical standards.
- Submissions must not contain any defamatory, libelous, or unlawful content.

Submission Process

- Content must be submitted through AIR's online submission portal.
- Ensure that all author details are accurately provided, including affiliations and contact information.

Review and Selection

- Only submitted papers will undergo a peer-review process.
- Authors will be notified of acceptance via email.

Publication and Distribution

- Accepted content will be published on the AIR website.
- Authors agree that AIR may distribute the content in both digital and print formats.
- We are keen to amplify and share the ideas and perspectives of those who submit papers. This
 may take various forms, depending on the nature, volume and focus of submitted papers. We
 may publish submissions on AIR website, invite authors to discuss their paper on AIR's podcast
 and/or arrange other events, convenings and opportunities for authors to connect and engage
 with interested participants in the financial services, regulation and innovation ecosystems.
